10 Days of Interactive Citizen-Reporting from Refugee Camps on the Chad-Darfur Border Putting a Face on the Numbers

What: Starting on July 10 and for 10 consecutive days, i-ACT will present the immediacy of the ongoing genocide in Darfur, through daily video webcasts and interactive blog at http://stopgenocidenow.org. People will connect person-toperson with the victims, as i-ACT's citizen-reporters returns to refugee camps on the Chad-Darfur border.

Why: The ongoing genocide in Darfur, Sudan has claimed well over 400,000 lives and brutally displaced over 2.5 million people. Refugees and internally displaced persons are in grave danger, and their lives depend on the international community's actions in the next days and weeks. The numbers are horrific, but the individual human stories are compelling and give us the real reason why we should act: the shared humanity.

Who: Gabriel Stauring, Consuelo Stauring, and Yuen Lin Tan, from Stop Genocide Now, will be the i-ACT team on the ground, supported by an amazing team of volunteers in the USA and other parts of the world. Stop Genocide Now is a member of the Save Darfur Coalition and serves as an awareness and action tool for all activist and faith, school, and civic organizations. i-ACT is made up of everyone that participates in the interactive-activism.

When: Reports from Chad will begin on July 10, 2007. There will be 10 days of videowebcasting and interactive reports.

Where: From refugee camps on the Chad-Darfur border, to the entire world.

Note: Gabriel, Consuelo, and Yuen Lin will be available for interviews during the 10 days on the field and upon return to the US. Pictures and video from the camps will be made available to the media upon request.
